Mark H. Webb was born on March 17, 1888 in either Russia or Poland, and lived for some time in Sheffield, England with his family. On the census from Sheffield, they were recorded with the last name Werbalski. They immigrated to the United States in 1896, residing in Boston, Massachusetts.

Mark Webb served in World War I from 1918-1919 as an ambulance driver in France. During his service, Webb corresponded with his sisters Bessie, Bertha, and Rose. After his service he worked as a lawyer. He died in Nashville, Tennessee on February 26, 1934.

Scope and Contents

This collection is comprised of correspondence from Mark H. Webb to his sisters, and typed copies of letters and poems from the War Department. From the correspondence, we surmise

that one of his sisters worked for the War Department during World War I, and that the typed copies were saved from her time working there. The correspondence focuses on Webb's experience during his service, including the challenges he faced as a Jewish man, and day-to-day life on the front and in France. Included are records from Ancestry.com retrieved during collection processing to supplement biographical information about Webb.
